The historical development of the concept of the unconscious prior to and in the work of Breuer and Freud is first presented, followed by a detailed discussion of two of Freud's personality models. Early psychoanalytic theory and modalities of clinical work are then reviewed. An overview of "post-classical" psychoanalysis is also provided, with the special emphasis on the work of Donald Winnicott, Heinz Kohut, and Stephen Mitchell. Finally, the status of psychoanalysis in the 21st century is portrayed.
