

## MAE written exams WiSe 2021/22 – General Information

The exam periods in the winter term 2021/22 are:

**Exam period 1: 31.01.-19.02.22**

**Exam period 2: 21.03.-08.04.22**

### Administrative Aspects

- For each module exam (written exams on Campus and papers), you have three trials.
- You are registered for the first round of exams automatically and are obligated to participate.
- When failing the first round of an exam, the student loses one trial and must retake the written exam in the second exam period.
- When failing the second round of an exam, the student must attend a compulsory study consultation with the program coordinator and try for the third time in the first exam period of the following year.
- Failing an exam three times means failing the entire program and being exmatriculated.

### Sickness

In case of sickness, please withdraw by sending an e-mail to: [exams@ipu-berlin.de](mailto:exams@ipu-berlin.de) explicitly mentioning the module of the exam you are withdrawing from.

- Please send separate e-mails if you want to withdraw from more than one exam. You will unfortunately only receive one automated response by the server, but please refrain from double-checking.
- Within 3 working days after the exam, please submit a sickness certificate by a doctor to [studienbuero@ip-berlin.de](mailto:studienbuero@ip-berlin.de). If the certificate is not submitted in time, you would have missed the exam without excuse and therefore lose one trial.
- Unexcused absences from examinations are assessed with the grade 5.0 ("failed"), though not counting towards your final grade - but you lose one attempt.

### Hygiene Regulations

Like classes, written exams take place on campus again in compliance with safety measures and hygiene rules.

- The assigned room in which you will be writing the exam will be visible to you in the morning of the exam in CampusNet (under exam details).
- The IPU is making use of the "3G rules" (vaccinated, tested, or recovered) for in-person participation. Negative test results may not be more than 24 hours old. The test must have been performed at an official testing center by trained personnel (self-test results are not accepted).
- Participation in multiple exams per week requires proof of two negative tests each week, which may not be separated by more than 48 hours.
- It is required to wear an FFP2 mask in all hallways and rooms at IPU.
- The safe-distancing rules should be kept where possible (at least 1.5m from other people). When following the safe-distancing rules, masks may be removed when at your seat
- If this is not possible in exams, an FFP2 mask must be worn for the duration of the exam.
- Avoid shaking hands, hugging and make use of the disinfectant dispensers located around the campus.

- Those with symptoms of acute respiratory sickness or with general flu-like symptoms (coughing, congestion, fever) and those who have been directed to quarantine may not enter the campus (in that case, the sickness rule applies – please submit a proof).

**Positive test result?** In this case, please [contact Prof. Birgit Stürmer](#) as soon as possible.

- Where possible, rooms should be aired out regularly, building doors should be used only as either entrances or exits, and be marked accordingly. The same is valid for hallways within the building.
- A responsible Corona representative will be appointed for every event. He/She is responsible for making efforts to ensure hygiene and safe-distance rules are being followed.
